**Call to Order** at 7:06 PM by Principal Woodhead.

**Pledge of Allegiance** was said.

**Roll Call:** Principal Woodhead, Etta Toci, Donna Austin, Jennifer Clutts, Kati Baker were present. Cris Crum, Debbie Poindexter and Sherree Drake were excused.

No minutes were available for the last meeting.

**Student Council:** Principal Woodhead reported that the Student Council had a spirit week planned for the week of October 31<sup>st</sup>. Monday will be costume, celebrity, orange & black day. Tuesday will be pajama day. Wednesday is crazy hat/ hair/ sock day. Thursday is recycle day and Friday will be blue & white day. The council is also planning a movie night for pre-k through 4<sup>th</sup> grade on November 4<sup>th</sup>.
